

PUBLIC SECTOR APPRENTICESHIP REPORT

1. Background

- 1.1 In May 2017 the Apprenticeship Levy was introduced by the Department for Education. All employers with an annual pay bill of more than £3 million pay 0.5% of their monthly payroll into the levy. For 2023-24 this equates to £320k per year for Creative Education Trust.
- 1.2 The public sector apprenticeships target ended on 31 March 2022. Whilst there is no longer a target set in legislation for public sector employers, as a public body, the Trust is still required to report annually on apprenticeship data.
