### **University of Warwick**

We are proud to be one of the few lead partners able to offer access to teacher training on the University of Warwick digital PGCE programme. Wherever they are in the UK, our trainees can benefit from the Ofsted 'Outstanding' provision of the University of Warwick, ranked 9th UK University in the Guardian University Guide (2024).

### **Coventry University**

This global provider enables us to offer apprenticeship opportunities throughout our Trust schools. Apprenticeships offer trainees the opportunity to earn a salary whilst completing their training and are more commonly offered to as a progression route for current Trust employees. Trainees joining a teaching apprenticeship should have at least two years' experience working in a classroom setting and be familiar with the requirements of a school environment.

### **OUR SCHOOLS**

School Led teacher training courses are offered in a broad range of subjects across our school network.

The course requires trainees to complete two placements; the main placement being at your selected host school, with a shorter placement, most commonly in another nearby Trust school. This placement will be arranged on your behalf and with consideration to your travel commitments.

### QUALIFICATIONS

GCSE: 4 – 9 / A–C English and Maths

Degree closely related to the subject you'd like to teach: Minimum 2:2, preferred 2:1 or above

Should your degree provide lesser subject specialist knowledge, candidates with an A Level in their chosen subject may be able to meet the eligibility criteria via a recommendation to a Subject Knowledge Enhancement course.

### ELIGIBILITY

Eligible to work in the UK

Nothing to preclude you from completing Disclosure & Barring Service (DBS) check

### SUBJECT KNOWLEDGE ENHANCEMENT (SKE) COURSES

Don't hold back from applying for teacher training due to your subject confidence – you can top up your subject knowledge with an SKE.

These courses are available if:

- your degree wasn't in your chosen subject, but is closely related
- you studied the subject at A level, but not at degree level
- you have an unrelated degree, but relevant professional experience in the subject
- it's been some time since you used your degree knowledge

The length can vary from an 8-week refresher course to 28 weeks depending on the additional specialist knowledge required to enable you to teach the subject effectively.
